



Sports Premium Impact Statement 2016 - 2017

South View Primary School is committed to ensuring broad, high quality provision in Physical Education and Sport. In ensuring that our community can realise increased participation in PE and Sport, all of our pupils can be encouraged to develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

From September 2015 our vision has been supported by additional government funding to promote PE & Sport. South View Primary School will receive approximately £14500 in the 2016/17 academic years. During this current we will strongly focus on

- developing and adding to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

We will do this through

- hire qualified sports specialist education consultant to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs
- run sport competitions
- increase pupils’ participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools
