#### **Note from Mrs Henderson**

Attendance for this term is 95.9%. Our aim by the end of the academic year is 97%.

Please can we also remind parents that registers are taken at 8:55! Please ensure your children arrive before this time so that they can put away their lunch boxes, take off their coats, organise their 'stuff' and be sat in their seat for the register. If for any reason you are struggling to get your child/children into school please contact Mrs Henderson or Mrs Strickland to discuss how we can support you.

If we have reason to believe that your child is **not ill and there** is another reason for absence (i.e. we have been told the family is actually on holiday!) the school is **not obliged to record the absence** as illness.

#### Why is attendance so important?

Regular attendance is vital to help children achieve and get the best possible start in life. Children not attending school regularly have their educational progress undermined, have lower attainment and make less progress and can also struggle to develop friendship groups at school. Parents can be taken to court under the Education Act 1996 if they don't make sure their child attends school without good reason (as defined in law) and if the child has too many unauthorised absences.

#### Why do I get a letter when my child's attendance is below 90%?

We will send you a letter each half term if your child's attendance is below 90%. You will receive this letter even if all of your child's absences have been authorised. This is so you are aware that your child's absence is beginning to cause a concern and may have an impact on their education. If your child has been ill for a few days at the beginning of the academic year they may receive a letter for a reason that was unavoidable; we still send the letter as we want to ensure you are informed of this concern each half term.

#### Isn't 90% attendance good?

If your child attends school 90%, or less, every year they are school age then by the time they sit their GCSE's or equivalent, they will have missed one whole academic year of learning.

#### What can I do to improve my child's attendance?

- Ensure they are in school on time every day.
- If they are seriously ill please let school know on the first morning of their illness.
- If you child has a cough or cold then they can attend school.
- If you are unsure about whether they are too ill for school then check the NHS website www.nhs.uk/Livewell/Yourchildatschool
- Don't take holidays in school time.
- If your child has a long term illness that may impact on their attendance then please contact the school office, there may be things in school we can do to support.

If something else is making it difficult for your child to attend school every day then please speak to your child's class teacher or the school office to arrange an appointment to discuss any specific personal circumstances.

#### **Reading Challenge**

#### **Free School Meals and Pupil Premium**

Is your joint family income UNDER £16,190 per year? Are in receipt of any of the benefits listed below:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support from NASS (National Asylum Support Service) under part 6 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual income of no more than £16,190
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit.

If so, you are very likely to be eligible to apply for Free School Meals. As well as this giving you the opportunity to provide your child/children with a hot meal every day, every successful application mean that the school receive an extra £1,320 to support your child. This funding (Pupil Premium) is used to employ high quality staff, subsidise trips and events, purchase resources to support learning and ensure all pupils make good progress.

If you are ELIGIBLE to apply for free school meals PLEASE apply, EVEN IF YOUR CHILD PREFERS A PACKED LUNCH. Please contact the school office if you require further details.
