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Summary:

South View had a good year in competitions and within the league, winning a number of competitions (Y3/4 & Y5/6 athletics, Y5/6 Summer Olympics) and the Y5/6 boy's football league, placing in the top 3 for other competitions (Y5/6 football, Kwik cricket and netball).

The introduction of inter-house competitions at lunchtimes has offered the Sports leaders a chance to develop their skills at forming teams, managing them and leading them with positive sportsmanship, equality and respect.
