URGENT - Household Support Fund

We will be allocating a household support voucher of a **£75 voucher** per eligible benefit related free school meal pupil of school age i.e. from reception to year 6, to eligible families by **Friday 1st December**.

Only families recorded as eligible for Benefit Related FSM on the 17th November will qualify, any families who become eligible after this date will not qualify.

This grant is to provide families with support to purchase food to the value of £75 per eligible pupil. You will be given the option of choosing vouchers for either:



- Crowland Co-op
- Asda
- Aldi

If your child is in receipt of Universal Infant Free School Meals (Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2) this does not mean you automatically qualify for a voucher, you must be eligible for BENEFIT RELATED Free school meals. You can apply for this here:


