
## Year 3 - Savage Stone Age - History

## **Key vocabulary**

- Archaeologists People who work out our history by looking at artefacts that have been found.
- Artefact An object made by human beings, Neolithic Is the later part
  of the stone-age and follows the Palaeolithic and Mesolithic age.
- · Barrow- long mound where bodies were buried
- B.C. Before Christ. A date like 250BC means 250 years before Christ was born.
- Forge- where heating melts and allows metal to be made
- · Henge- upright stones ditches and mounds
- Hunter-gatherers People who mainly live by hunting, fishing and gathering wild fruit.
- · Mesolithic. Middle Stone Age
- · Neolithic New Stone Age
- Paleolithic Earliest period of the Stone Age when chipped stone tools were used
- Prehistoric- before the Romans and written records
- Prey An animal that is hunted for its food.
- · Ritual A ceremony, often religious
- Tribe/Tribal group of people, often of related families, who live in the same area and share the same language, culture, and history

NB Lithic at end of word means stone













In 1850, a Stone Age village thought to have been built around 3000 BC was discovered on Orkney, off the North coast of Scotland. Stonehenge is a famous prehistoric monument in southern England, built at the end of the Stone Age and into the Bronze Age.
