Year 5 and 6 - Young Voices

Only 7 more sleeps until YOUNG VOICES. Please ensure your children are practising the songs WITHOUT reading the lyrics along (we should know them by now).

Some reminders:

If you have ordered a lunch though Hearty Kitchen then a packed lunch will be supplied, your child will still need a tea to be packed up with extra snacks and drinks. Please note, most children open their snacks within **minutes** of us pulling out of the D-ring, so when we say extra snacks maybe pack a bit extra than that!

If your child needs medication on the day this must be labelled with their name and dosage, and handed in to the school office or to Mrs Nizzer.

If you have ordered a Young Voices T-Shirt for your child these have now been handed out. These can be worn underneath their school sweatshirts/cardigans. Please do not park in the D Area at the front of the school as the coaches will pull in there. We expect there to be a lot of cars, so please park safely, bearing in mind we have around 100 tired children to deliver to you IN THE DARK!

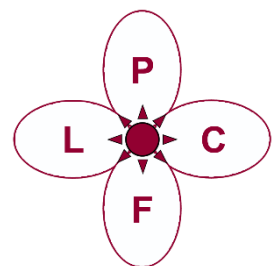

Certain types of behaviour can be not only highly stressful for the family, but also take up so much time and resources that they can have a large impact on the family and child engaging in everyday activities. This session will look at:

- What are behaviours of concern.
- The types of behaviours that may be displayed (such as verbal and physical aggression, breaking objects, escape and avoidance and self-neglect).
- What happens physically to a child when displaying these behaviours.
- How to establish what the behaviour may be telling us.
- Why they may happen.
- How to put a plan into place, as well as some strategies that may help reduce such behaviours and promote positive ones.
